



What is patriarchy?

Patriarchy means "the rule of the father"

Patriarchy is a social system in which men hold primary power and predominate in roles of political leadership, moral authority, social privilege and control of property.



Patriarchal societies date back less than 10,000 years.

Hunter-gatherer societies remain remarkable for gender equality, men and women contribute a similar number of calories.

For our species, culture is our natural and key to understanding our behaviors and motivations. We are driven by culture more than instinct.





Characteristics of a Patriarchal System

Male Dominance

Men make all the decisions in both society and in their family unit, hold all positions of power and authority, are considered superior.

Male Identification

Men are concerned with identification that includes qualities of control, strength and forcefulness.



Characteristics of a Patriarchal System

Male Centeredness

The center of activity and progression is on men and what they do to move the society forward. Men are the heroes in all situations and are the center of social engagement.

Obsession with Control

Men living in a patriarchal system or society must be in control at all times.

They have a desire to control all social and family situations and must make all decisions regarding finances and education.






Why Patriarchy is Bad for Men

4 Reflectiveness

A big aspect of upholding the norms of masculinity is that men often don't put too much effort into questioning or reflecting on such norms.

Status Quo

It enables men to remain comfortable in their privileges, in their dominance, in their reverence, while never having to question the issues women and nonbinary people have to deal with in relation to their comfort.



Hierarchy

Men are paid more, offered jobs more often, pay less for products, men aren't subjected to constant catcalling or sexual violence, men don't have to face their insecurities, and men are happy about that.

Competition

A lot of the actions men take and the way men think are related to the desire to be better than others.



Why Patriarchy is Bad for Men



Rape Culture 6

Society has set up in a way that makes rape, sexual violence, or romantic manipulation not only possible, but rather a normal, expected occurrence for many people.

5 Ignorance

Patriarchy wants men to believe is that all men are equal, while it also supports the systems that oppress people who aren't white, or rich, or able-bodied, or cisgender, or any combination of traits that are considered the "norm."

..... 7 Toxicity

Patriarchy makes everything worse not only for those who are subjected to all of its negativity, hatred, and oppression, but it also makes things worse the men who benefit from it.





Patriarchy Statistics

Women are 47% more likely to suffer severe injuries in car crashes because safety features are designed for men

For every female film character, there are 2.24 male characters







Patriarchy Statistics

Only 6 countries give women equal legal work rights as men. A typical economy gives women three-quarters the rights of men.

In the STEM departments only 22% of the students are females, compared with 78% who are male.



Action #5

Advocate for a definition of consents based on "Yes" rather than "No"



Action #3

Reframe patriarchy as an issue for everyone



Action #6

Teach boys and men how to authentically communicate their emotions

accountability
systems for
handling sexual
violence.



Train men to challenge others on their patriarchal and sexist ideas and actions.



Hold the media accountable for the focus on dominant culture.
